The weed species controlled in this plan are part of the New England Weeds Authority's program to prevent the spread of Priority Weeds and undesirable vegetation within the Walcha Council area and to maintain the roads and urban areas within a managed framework.

### **Definitions**

**Total Grass Control**: Carried out around guideposts, guard rails and signage to prevent long grass interfering with furniture visibility. On RMS roads this work is carried out as per RMS standards.

**Eucalypt and Wattle Suckers control:** Carried out along road verges, drainage lines and general service areas to prevent visibility interference for road users. Small tree re growth is targeted to maintain these areas in their current condition.

**Environmental Weeds**: Species such as Privet, Cotoneaster, Firethorn and Hawthorn are treated as part of the roadside maintenance program. These plants produce prolific amounts of small berries that are spread by birds and foxes and have the potential to form dense roadside stands if left unchecked.
